

Efficient Environmental Education through ISEERB

DoD Board Certifies Environmental Training

The Interservice Environmental Education Review Board (ISEERB) reviews and endorses environmental education and training courses for the Department of Defense (DoD) components.

The “ISEERB-approved” rating relies on subject-matter experts (SMEs) from DoD components (Navy, Army and Air Force) to review each course. The course must meet two guidelines:

- Have common content suitable for two or more DoD components, and
- Use the most economical and effective delivery method (e.g., on-site/off-site classroom instruction, video, interactive CD-ROM, satellite, or suitable combination).

There are three primary reasons why military personnel should use ISEERB-approved courses to meet their environmental training needs. Courses with the “ISEERB-approved” rating:

1. Eliminate duplication of course development efforts by DoD components,
2. Maximize the distribution of quality environmental training, and
3. Reduce development and delivery costs.

Schools That Deliver ISEERB-Approved Courses

There are five schools that deliver ISEERB-approved courses:


1. Civil Engineers Corps Officers School (CECOS) [for the Navy],
2. Office of Safety and Health Environmental Training Center [for the Navy],
3. Army Logistics Management College (ALMC),
4. Air Force Institute of Technology (AFIT), and
5. Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) Training Center (DTC)

Defense Logistics Agency Training Center

DLA's overall mission is to provide best value logistics support to America's Armed Forces, in peace and war, around the clock, around the world. If military service members eat it, wear it, drive it, shoot it, or burn it, chances are that DLA helps to provide it. DLA also disposes of materiel and equipment that is no longer needed.

The DLA Training Center (DTC), located in Columbus, OH, is the workforce development organization for DLA.

DTC's goal is to offer a wide array of training options. DTC provides education and training development and delivery services with a full range of courses for DoD components and can teach subject matter ranging from "The ABCs of Demilitarization" to "Unlocking Contracting Issues."



Buying Green: A Multifunctional Approach to Pollution Prevention

"Buying Green: A Multifunctional Approach to Pollution Prevention" is a two-day ISEERB-approved workshop that has the following objectives:

- Provide an overview of Federal pollution prevention initiatives and how they relate to the DoD acquisition process, and
- Demonstrate how, through affirmative procurement (Eco Purchasing), DoD components can create markets for recovered materials and environmentally preferred products and services.



Who Should Attend

This workshop is designed for DoD and other Federal employees in the buying community who are responsible for purchasing or writing specifications to purchase items that can be made with:

- Recovered materials,
- Hazardous or toxic materials,
- Ozone depleting substances,
- Energy-efficient components, or
- Items that use alternative fuels.

Course Content

The workshop includes a forum to share the following types of ideas and success stories:

- Pollution Prevention (P2) hierarchy,
- P2 Executive Orders (EO)/regulations,
- Affirmative Procurement Program (APP),
- Environmentally preferred products,
- Life cycle costing,
- Acquisition planning,
- Federal Acquisition Regulations (FAR) requirements,
- Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) "Eco Purchasing,"
- Bridging the communication gap between acquisition and environmental staffs, and
- Comprehensive procurement guidelines for products containing recovered materials per 40 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 247.

- Acquisition and Contract Management,
- Environmental Protection/Hazardous Materials,
- Logistics Support,

- Property Disposal,
- Quality Assurance and Technical Functions,
- Safety, and
- General.

In addition to educational development and delivery services, DTC provides a full range of multimedia products and

services. Additionally, DTC administers several high profile management development programs for DLA. DTC can provide the tools, training, guidance, and information necessary in the performance improvement arena.

Transportation of Hazardous Material/Hazardous Waste for DoD

“Transportation of Hazardous Material/Hazardous Waste for DoD” is an ISEERB-approved, introductory 5-day class that provides a comprehensive understanding of the Department of Transportation’s (DOT) hazardous material regulations. The course:

- Provides information on the shipper’s responsibility for surface transportation of hazardous material/hazardous waste (with an emphasis on hazardous waste), and
- Meets the DOT mandatory training requirement (49 CFR 172, Subpart H).



Who Should Attend

This course is designed for personnel who prepare/offer hazardous material/hazardous waste for highway shipment and/or sign Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) hazardous waste manifests.

Course Content

Transportation of hazardous material/hazardous waste includes information on the following:

- Hazardous material/hazardous waste identification and classification,
- Shipping papers (hazardous waste manifests),
- Packaging,
- Marking,
- Labeling,
- Placarding, and
- Emergency response.

Prerequisite: None

Maximum number of course participants: 25

Course cost: \$9,000 (per class) or \$450 (per student)

been around for many years. DTC has been developing computer-based training (CBT) and videos since before 1990 and has been preparing self-paced instruction for an even longer period of time. These areas are well-proven training systems in which DTC has experienced personnel and established programs.

Interactive Video Teletraining (IVT) (satellite broadcast instruction) is a new area for DTC. Although many organizations have been broadcasting via satellite for years, interactivity in video teletraining has been newly introduced into the training arena. DTC is currently training its staff and implementing cutting-edge training technology to provide the highest quality IVT. DTC can provide other forms of distributed learning including electronic job aids, CD-ROM instruction, web-based instruction, and other emerging technologies.

The DLA Training Center is implementing cutting-edge training technologies.

DTC looks at an array of distributed learning options as ingredients for creating a training system that specifically meets the needs of a particular training situation. DTC approaches each training situation with an analysis to determine the delivery method(s) that meets the needs of the customer and the students, and is cost effective.
